Occupy 13% of land designated "Bantustans" or "homelands"		Own/occupy 87% of land
Income less than 1/8 of Whites		Income eight times that of Blacks
Social/ occupational subordinates		Social/occupational superiors
No vote or voice in lawmaking, but must obey laws.		Make laws which everyone must follow
Must carry "pass" (identity book) at all times		Force Blacks to carry passes

15 million Blacks, 2 million Coloreds		Under 4 million Whites
Evicted and forced to live in bantustans, labor camps, shanty towns (ghettos), or other segregated areas		The quantity and quality of the land privilege whites
Families are divided according the economic needs of the Whites: Women, children and men are separated		Have the vote, control the government and military. (National Party sees itself as fascist)
1 doctor for every 40,000 High infant mortality		1 doctor for every 400
Whites destroyed their livelihood— took land and stole cattle		Whites own all industries—agriculture, gold, diamonds, etc.
Unequal pay, working conditions and opportunity		Skilled work is only permitted for Whites
Pass laws control where they are allowed to live and work—failure to have them is punishable by imprisonment		Unrestricted movement and privileged spaces
Pay for education and substandard curriculum and conditions.		Education is free
Prisoners in their own land.		gun ownership and training, as well as advanced weaponry for a strong military.
